

Municipality of Cumberland Equipment Loan Program

The Municipality of Cumberland Loan Program is designed to provide access to safe, well-maintained equipment for the purpose of supporting physical activity, and personal enjoyment. Equipment may be borrowed for a **2-week period** unless alternate arrangements have been made. Equipment availability is dependant on the immediate and future demand according to programming. Equipment drop-off, pick-up, and storage is arranged through Municipality of Cumberland Parrsboro, Nova Scotia Service Centre (Please call contact below). Equipment may be arranged for pick up from: the Parrsboro Service Centre, Parrsboro, Dr Carson & Marion Murray Community Centre in Springhill, Upper Nappan Service Center, Upper Nappan, or Pugwash Service Centre, Pugwash.

User's Rights & Responsibilities

1. The user is responsible for providing accurate and complete contact information on the Equipment Loan Registration Form.
2. The user is responsible for proper storage and care of the equipment borrowed during their lending period. Any damage to the equipment must be reported to the Municipality in a timely manner.
3. The user is responsible for ensuring that all equipment safety guidelines, and all provincial/federal laws, are followed while using the borrowed equipment.
4. Borrowed equipment must be used for its designed purpose only. Any misuse of equipment may result in the user being held financially responsible, immediate return of equipment to the Municipality, and may affect the user's future borrowing privileges.
5. User must contact the Active Living Coordinator to arrange pick up and drop off.
6. User is responsible for the pick-up and drop-off of the equipment to the Cumberland Equipment Loan storage facility.

Municipality Rights & Responsibilities

1. The Municipality is responsible for the equipment's general maintenance as needed.
2. The Municipality is responsible for the distribution, collection, and general maintenance of the equipment.
3. The Municipality reserves the right to impose and change borrowing periods based on changing circumstances.
4. If equipment is returned damaged, the Municipality reserves the right to revoke the user's future borrowing privileges.
5. Depending on the extent of the damage sustained to the equipment, the Municipality reserves the right to consider and pursue action against the user to pay the cost of repairs or replacement.
