Nova Scotia has expanded the list of materials that are acceptable under the Electronics Recycling Program. These items are now banned from landfill disposal and must be recycled. Electronics can be taken to the depot nearest you.

Compost dumpster bins have been placed throughout the municipality for your use. Please slide panels closed when finished to help keep bears and other animals out of the bins. Do not leave debris or litter in the area and note that garbage and recyclable materials are not permitted.

Permitted items include the following:

- Bread
- Coffee
- Dairy
- Damp & soiled paper
- Eggs & shells
- Facial tissues & napkins
- Fruit & vegetables
- Leaf & yard waste
- Meat, fish, bones
- Paper wrappers
- Paper plates
- Paper towel
- Pasta, grain, rice
- Pet waste/cat litter
- Pizza boxes
- Small branches
