

## **Municipality of Cumberland Bicycle Loan Program**

The Municipality of Cumberland Bicycle Lend Program is designed to provide access to safe, professionally maintained bikes for the purpose of active transportation, physical activity, and personal enjoyment. Bicycles may be borrowed for a **2-week period** unless alternate arrangements have been made. Bicycle drop-off, pick-up, and storage is in Parrsboro, Nova Scotia.

### **User's Responsibilities**

1. The user is responsible for providing accurate and complete contact information on the Cumberland Bike Lend Registration Form.
2. The user is responsible for proper storage and care of the equipment borrowed during their lending period. Any damage to the equipment must be reported to the Municipality in a timely manner.
3. The user is responsible for ensuring that all bicycle safety guidelines, proper road rules and all provincial bicycle laws are followed while using the borrowed equipment.
4. Borrowed equipment must be used for its designed purpose only. Any misuse of equipment may result in the user being held financially responsible, immediate return of equipment to the Municipality, and may affect the user's future borrowing privileges.
5. User must contact the Active Living Coordinator to arrange pick up and to ensure social distancing directives and sanitization measure are implemented.
6. User is responsible for the pick-up and drop-off of the bicycles to the Cumberland Bike Lend Storage Facility – storage location is in Parrsboro, NS.

### **Municipality Responsibilities**

1. The Municipality is responsible for the equipment's general maintenance as needed.
2. The Municipality reserves the right to impose and change borrowing periods based on changing circumstances.
3. If equipment is returned damaged, the Municipality reserves the right to revoke the user's future borrowing privileges.
4. Depending on the extent of the damage sustained to the equipment, the Municipality reserves the right to consider and pursue legal action against the user to pay the cost of repairs or replacement.
5. The Municipality is responsible for the distribution, collection, and sanitization of the bike. This ensures all public health directives are followed.
